The IsDB encourages Beneficiaries to actively consider and apply sustainable procurement, where appropriate for better development outcome.

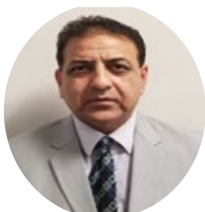
